Classical The other symphony

Don't get confused. Silicon Valley Symphony is not the same orchestra as Symphony Silicon Valley, the South Bay's premiere orchestra. The former (yes, Silicon Valley Symphony) is a hardworking community orchestra that puts on some unusually ambitious programs, often with first-rate soloists.

This weekend, Silicon Valley Symphony is bringing in an exceptional soloist, cellist Peter Wyrick, to perform the Saint-Saens Cello Concerto in A minor. Wyrick, the San Francisco Symphony's associate principal cellist, will perform in tribute to one of his longtime colleagues,

cellist Larry Granger, who died this year after a sudden illness, ending a near-30-year career with the San Francisco Symphony. There's real sentiment behind this weekend's program: During the 2008-09 season. Granger coached and rehearsed with Silicon Valley Symphony. He did it repeatedly and in a pinch, when the community orchestra experienced a musical emergency.
